ABOUT THE KEYNOTE:



Kordell Stewart was drafted in the 2nd round by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the 1995 draft and was a key asset in multiple offensive roles. He became a major contributor to the Steelers run to Super Bowl XXX. Stewart was given the nickname “Slash” due to his abilities as a utility player as quarterback/running back/punter/returner. Before his career as a Steeler, Stewart attended the University of Colorado playing under Coach Bill McCartney. He would become one of the most prolific quarterbacks in school history, setting records for completed passes, passing yards, and touchdown passes. On Sept 24th, 1994, Stewart threw a game-winning, 64-yard Hail Mary pass to Michael Westbrook in the closing seconds to beat the University of Michigan known as “The Miracle at Michigan.”
